Shabbos Parshas Tzav, 5768 - Purim

This Erev Shabbos we celebrate Purim followed by reading Parshas Tzav on Shabbos. What's the connection between the two?

Tzav means instruct and command. Who is the commander and instructor? G-d Almighty. Why is He referred to as the instructor? Because it's specifically through His commandment that we, the Jewish people, find existence, meaning and purpose. If G-d were not to instruct us, rather we'd come to the same conclusions on our own, it would not be a meaningful, everlasting relationship. Why? Because we are mortals and regardless of one's commitment to G-d, if it is generated by the person, it's limited. Anything that has a beginning has an end. However, when the relationship is generated by the Almighty G-d, who is omnipotent, etc, the relationship is limitless and eternal because G-d is eternal.

This is the underlying theme of Purim. On Purim we experienced an enemy who desired the destruction of the Jew. Haman's reason for the Jewish obliteration was because the Jew was different! The Jew represented permanence and unlimitness, something Haman and other non-Jews didn't have and despised. The Jew was "abnormal."

It's the Tzav theme that Purim expresses. We, at Chabad celebrate Purim with Torah true joy and invite you to join us.
